PART I-Introductory

1. These regulations may be cited as the Animals (Exportation, Importation, Protection and Control) Regulations (1999 Revision). Citation

PART II-Export and Import of Animals

2. No live animal may be exported from the Islands save under licence issued by the C.A.V.O. after application made to him in writing and payment of the fee prescribed in the First Schedule. Exportation of live animals
3. The forms of licences for the import and export of live animals are prescribed in the Second Schedule. Licence for importation of live animals
4. (1) No carcase, whether fresh, frozen, chilled, cured, pickled or otherwise preserved or treated, of any animal mentioned in column 1 of the Third Schedule, nor any part of such carcase, shall be imported into the Islands unless it is imported- Importation of carcasses
- (a) directly from one of the countries specified in the corresponding part of column 2 of the Third Schedule; and
 - (b) in accordance with such conditions as may be laid down by the C.A.V.O.
- (2) Subregulation (1) shall not apply to any thoroughly cooked boneless meat imported in hermetically sealed metal cans.
- (3) Only boneless meat shall be imported into the Islands from Costa Rica, Nicaragua and Honduras.
- (4) In this regulation-
- “thoroughly cooked meat” means meat that has been subjected to heat treatment and which has attained a temperature of not less than one hundred and seventy degrees Fahrenheit at the central point for a period of not less than two hours.

PART III-Protection of Animals

- Close season 5. The period from 1st February to the 31st July inclusive in each year is prescribed as a close season for the purposes of sections 2 and 67.
- Limitation on number of game birds which may be taken 6. The limit on the number of game birds which may be taken by one person on any one day is -
- (a) twelve White-Winged Doves, twelve White-Crowned Pigeons or any combination thereof:
Provided that the number of such birds taken shall not exceed twelve; and
 - (b) three Blue-Winged Teal.

PART IV-Control of Animals

- Establishment of pounds and poundkeepers 7. The places and persons set forth in Parts I and II of the Fourth Schedule are established as pounds and appointed as poundkeepers respectively for the purposes of section 42.
- Fee for service of notice of animals impounded 8. The prescribed fee for the service of notices for the purposes of section 43 is ten dollars per animal.
- Fee for maintenance of impounded animals 9. The daily prescribed daily maintenance fee for impounded animals for the purposes of section 45 is ten dollars per animal.
- Poundkeepers remuneration 10. For the purposes of section 48, poundkeepers are entitled to retain fifty per cent of all fees collected by them under regulation 8 and the whole of all fees collected under regulation 9.
- Seizure fees 11. (1) The prescribed seizure fee for the purposes of section 50 is twenty-five dollars per animal.
